Middle School	Kindness	Treating others as more important than self. Give without needing to be thanked (Luke 6:38)
	Conflict Resolution	Learning to speak the truth in love. Using compromise to achieve reconciliation. (Ephesians 4:15)
High School	Gracious	Choosing words and actions that demonstrate respect, compassion, and a forgiving attitude toward others. (Colossians 4:6)
	Trust-Building	Developing mutual respect. Nurturing a Christ-centered community. (Romans 12:10)
	Self-Sacrificing	Giving up what you want to do for what God wants you to do. (Philippians 2:3)

Middle School	Integrity	Keeping one's word. Doing the right thing even when no one is watching. (Proverbs 10:9)
	Self-Accountability	Taking responsibility for your actions and their outcomes. (1 John 3:18)
High School	Wise & Discerning	Seeking to live in a God-honoring manner in an ever changing culture. (1 Corinthians 13:11)
	Peer Accountability	Holding one another to a Biblical standard of conduct. (Ephesians 4:15)

Middle School	Service	Giving personal time, treasures, and talents for the good of others. (2 Corinthians 9:6)
